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Early this year, I received an e-mail from Koji Tanaka Sensei asking me whether I can spend sometime at IMS for the exchange and enhancement of collaboration. Being permitted on sabbatical leave from my university, National Taiwan University, I am pleased and honored to accept the invitation as a visiting professor at IMS from Sept. to Dec. 2008.
